Learning and Teaching – We continue to strive to further improve our teaching and learning approach in school and work closely with other schools in Stockport and out of Borough. We enjoy celebrating ‘The Adswood Way’ with others in particular our unique Enjoy, Believe, Achieve Award book which promotes our life skills curriculum.

We are now coming to the end of our second year using the Read, Write, Inc Phonics scheme which is taught from Nursery through school. We were congratulated last week after an observation visit on our consistent and strong approach to the delivery of reading. Please continue to read with your child at home.



We are noting an increase of reports across Stockport connected to online bullying and safety. We send out regular posters on seesaw to highlight to parents the age limits of some of the apps, privacy settings and how the use of some apps can be unsafe for our children. Our school website has links to a number of websites that parents may find useful when, and if you have to deal with, any of the above. We continue to talk to children in school about devices and the importance of being safe online.

Stockport County and Network Rail continue to support school in providing a programme for our Year 6 children on Mental Health and the importance of staying healthy for our body and mind. The sessions have been extremely successful and we look to continue the link with the club.

Uniform/Sun Cream/Jewellery – A reminder that as and when the sun starts to shine on Adswold, we encourage sensible footwear. No flip flops and small sandals are allowed in school.

We are not able to apply sun cream as per policy and therefore ask that on hotter days, you apply the cream before school and send your child in with a summer hat to wear.

Children are only allowed to wear studs in school. No rings, necklaces or bracelets are allowed. False nails are also not part of our policy as they can cause injury.
