We have conducted a 'hands up' survey to see whether the school street closure has impacted on the number of children that walk to school each day. This data has been sent to the local authority. The school street project (road closure) will finish on the last day of this term. In September, please continue to support walking to school where possible to enable our children a safer route to and from school each day.

Thank you for the responses on our **annual questionnaire** that was sent out on seesaw last week. The results were so positive and will be used as part of our school improvement as we move forward to next year. The staff have worked incredibly hard this year under challenging circumstances following a two year break in education. We have focussed on re- establishing routines, structure, boundaries, support for all our families and the community and continuing to educate all our children to ensure the gaps in learning are addressed and progress can be made. We have revisited policies, made adjustments, reviewed timetables and environments to ensure the school is a happy and safe environment for all where our children can thrive. As always, we put our children first. The children have also completed a questionnaire that has enabled us to plan ahead. They have a voice and they are heard. **Everyone matters.**
